If you're planning your estate, consider the following options

Create or review your legal documents

\bigcirc	Will — a legal document in which a person states who should receive their possessions after they pass away.
	Power of attorney — a written authorization to allow another to act on your behalf in private affairs, business or some other legal matter.
	Trust — a fiduciary relationship created at the direction of an individual through which one or more trustees hold the individual's property subject to certain duties to use and protect it for the benefit of others.

TIP It's a good idea to review these documents annually to maintain accuracy, and to align with the named beneficiaries on your account(s)
